 There are a range of great rewards and recognition available for participating in Wastebuster programmes, such as the West Sussex Planet Protector Challenge and Climate Enterprise Award, and Wastebuster national campaigns, such as Waste Week, Switch Off Fortnight and Recycle to Read. Rewards range from funding to resources, such as books and exclusive opportunities. Wastebuster also issues certificates of achievement, such as the Bronze, Silver, Gold and Green Ambassador Awards for the Planet Protector Challenge. Ambassadors can double any recycling rewards earned if they are one of the first 3 schools each academic

year to reach Ambassador status for completing all missions. We recommend checking the rewards and recognition available on all programmes as campaigns as they change annually.
